

MZU MODES OF STUDY AND EVALUATION

Mount Zion University has two modes of study, a student should choose the best mode for himself/herself;

- 1. The Closed Textbook Exam Approach
- 2. The Open Textbook Exam Approach

1. The Closed Textbook Exam Approach

This includes a test and a final exam. A student is given a course material, additional books and audio lectures under supervision of an instructing professor. When a student is ready for tests and exams then he/she orders for them. Tests and Exams will be conducted under supervision of national directors.

2. The Open Textbook Exam Approach

MZU has also a modular curriculum, it may look simple, but that is not the reality, and obvious the students have to work hard and on a regular basis if they have to meet the expectations of the professors.

On the open Textbook Exam approach the assignments are assessed on stricter criteria than in normal exams. The following is your assignment for each module. Remember that your assignments are also your exams:

- A student is given a course module to study on his/her own pace.
- After satisfactory study a student should do a summary of each Module in his/her own words.
- The minimum size should be 1000 words, but there is no maximum word-limit.
- A thorough critique of the module where you highlight the significance as well as weaknesses of the Module. The critique can include topics such as the content, language, style, communication, or any other aspect that you can critique.
- Suggestion for improvement. You can suggest any kind of improvement or addition that would improve the material.

- Explain the way in which the Module helped you and also tell us how you would be able to use this information in your personal life and also in your community.
- If you find any spelling or grammatical errors in the course material do mention them in your summary/critique so we can improve documents.
- Finally, you should refer not less than four other authors, what do they say about the topic.

How to send these assignments to us:

- The assignments should be sent in DOC format.
- DO NOT send as PDF or in any format other than the mentioned above.
- Each assignment should be numbered and named the way it is numbered. DO NOT try to substitute names and numbers as per your fancy. This will result in immediate rejection of your submission.
- You should place your name and program name (such as LLB., PhD) on top of EACH assignment.
- If you do not include all the points given above, your assignment will not be accepted.
- Send assignments as email ATTACHMENTS
- Assignments are to be sent to assignments@mzuedu.online.
- DO NOT send them to multiple emails and do not overload MZU inboxes. In other words, MZU has zero tolerance for assignments that are not done according to protocol. Our aim is not to give you a degree, but rather to TRAIN you properly.

Here is the suggest cover-page for assignment for each module that you send to us.
